ROAD MAINTENANCE WORK STARTS ON PADMAN DRIVE IN ALBURY

Roads and Maritime Services will start road maintenance work on Padman Drive in West Albury later this month to improve safety for motorists.

Member for Albury, Greg Aplin said the NSW Government is funding the \$1.5 million project to provide a stronger, smoother and safer road surface and improve drainage.

“The work will involve replacing aging drainage pipes, replacing the road surface as well as repairing the existing guardrail and walking path,” Mr Aplin said.

“This road rebuilding work will extend the life of the road, improve the road surface and reduce future maintenance costs.

“To complete the work in the shortest possible time, Padman Drive will be closed to traffic between Thurgoona and Day streets. A detour will be in place via Pemberton Street for the length of the project and will be signposted.”

“Work will start on Wednesday 28 February on Padman Drive between Thurgoona and Day streets, along the Monument Hill Parklands boundary, opposite the Murray River.

“Work will be carried out seven days a week between 7.30am and 6.30pm, weather permitting. Night work up to 10pm may also occur from Friday 16 March. The project is expected to be completed by late March, weather permitting.”

Mr Aplin said the project would be completed in two stages. The first stage will involve replacing the existing drainage and is expected to be completed by Thursday 15 March.

“The second stage of the project will involve removing the existing road surface and replacing it with new asphalt. This stage is expected to start in mid-March and be completed by Thursday 29 March.

“Motorists should plan their trip, allow extra travel time and follow the direction of all signs.

“Roads and Maritime thanks motorists for their patience during this important road upgrade work.”
