FUNDING ANNOUNCED - 2018 COMMUNITY BUILDING PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM

Our local communities have today secured \$330,000 in funding for a total of 11 projects through the NSW Government's 2018 Community Building Partnership Program.

Member for Albury, Greg Aplin said the State Government funds will deliver much-needed improvements to local facilities including:

- \$106,986 for the external refurbishment of the Holbrook Early Learning Centre,
- \$11,000 for playground safety upgrades at Aspect Riverina School for kids with autism,
- \$5,857 to replace windows, paint and interior wall repairs for the Jerilderie Men's Shed, and
- \$20,000 to upgrade an existing 'open' transport vehicle to an 'enclosed' vehicle for Foodshare.
- \$20,000 to upgrade the Hall and purchase a utility trailer for the 1st Albury Scout Group.

"The NSW Government's strong economic management ensures we are in a position to invest in these important local projects.

"I congratulate all the organisations that were successful in their application and look forward to seeing how these projects make a real difference for community groups in the area."

Liberal candidate for Albury, Justin Clancy said "This is fantastic news for our local organisations, this grassroots funding will directly help to create a more vibrant and inclusive local community providing positive outcomes."

The Community Building Partnership program has funded some 13,800 community projects since it commenced nearly a decade ago.
